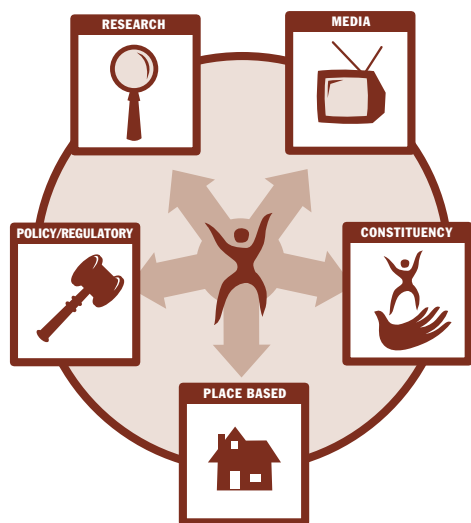


# Primary Focus Areas of Partnership Organizations
